

# *Registration Policies*

**HOW TO ENTER** Entries for all events will **NOT** be accepted before **Monday, February 1, 2010**. Web registration will again be available starting at 10:00 a.m. the same day. Please have your Customer Identification number available. If you have never competed in a KGA-PGA, Inc. tournament, you will not have an ID number. Follow the easy on screen instructions to complete the new member online registration process. If you plan on registering via mail, complete the registration application and be sure to mark the appropriate tournaments. Entries to the Championships will be confirmed by e-mail only – please provide your e-mail address. Entries into the Pepsi Junior Golf Tour will be confirmed via your membership packet sent on **Monday, May 3, 2010**. Be sure to provide alternate tournaments in case your first selections are full.

**\*\*Telephone and Fax entries will NOT be accepted, no matter the circumstance\*\***

**REFUNDS** Refunds will only be granted to participants whose requests are received via a phone call, voicemail, e-mail, or written letter to Golf House Kentucky at least **FORTY-EIGHT (48)** hours prior to the scheduled event. All refunds will be issued at the end of the tournament season. If you have registered for the Pepsi Junior Golf Tour, the membership fee is non-refundable.

**NOTE: Refunds for the Kentucky Junior Amateur Championship and the PGA Junior Championship will not be given after the deadline date.**

**CHANGES** Should you need to make a change during the season, please follow the guidelines listed in this section to ensure that your change is processed correctly. Call Golf House Kentucky or e-mail the Director, Junior Golf at least forty eight hours prior to the tournament for notification of the change. We will do our best to provide you a tee time at this point.

# *Spectator Policies*

Spectators are encouraged to attend all events. It is the player's responsibility to keep spectators away. Please come to the course and enjoy watching the juniors compete on their own. Rules for spectators are as follows:

Spectator carts will be allowed, when available, from the host facility. All carts are to remain on the provided paths – no exceptions. In the event there are no paths provided, carts should be at least 5 feet from the fairway cut of the hole being played. Spectators will respect the entire field of participants and stop all cart movement while a player is preparing to, and making, a stroke. A warning will be given on the first offense. A subsequent violation of this policy will require the spectator to forfeit the use of the cart for the rest of the event, without refund.

Only staff members from the KGA-PGA, Inc. will give rulings and advice to the participants, at the request of the individual. The staff is there to assist in any way possible.

Only participants in the event will be allowed to walk in the fairways. Spectators should remain off all teeing areas and putting greens. Spectators should remain at least 30 yards from the players at all times. \*Exception: If the player requests food, drink, or anything for personal safety, then a spectator may approach a participant to deliver what was requested. The spectator should then leave the area immediately and allow the player to continue his/her play. A warning will be given on the first offense. If a subsequent violation should occur, the spectator will be asked to go to the clubhouse for remainder of the participant's round.

Spectators should turn their cellular device to silent or vibrate for the entire round. When making calls please be courteous to our golfers.

**To ensure players have enough fluids, refreshments are intended for participants only.**

# *Pace of Play*

The Rules of Golf require that a player shall at all times play without undue delay. The administration of pace of play will be handled by the Rules Committee of the KGA-PGA, Inc. Any appeal of a penalty must be referred to the Designated Tournament Director of the event immediately upon completion of the round and **HIS/HER DECISION IS FINAL**.

**Out of Position** – A group is deemed out of position when starting the play of any hole, which is clear of all players AND/OR the elapsed time for the round averages more than 15 minutes per hole.

**Undue Delay** – A player in a group that is out of position shall be subject to penalty if during the round he takes 40 seconds or more on two occasions to play any stroke. \*Exception – An additional 10 seconds will be allowed for the first to play from the teeing ground on a par 3 hole, the first to play a second stroke on a par 4 or par 5 hole, the first to play a third stroke on a par 5 hole, and the first to play on or around the putting green.

**Notification of Timing** – All players in a group out of position shall be notified they are being timed and observed.

**Warnings** – When a player in a group out of position takes 40 seconds or more on one occasion, he shall be warned of that fact immediately. Only one warning per player will be given after group has been notified that they are being timed.

**Imposition of Penalties** – Any player who is penalized shall be immediately informed after playing from the teeing ground of the next hole or, in the event of a penalty during the play of the last hole of the round, at the scoring table.

**Penalties** – 1st bad time: Warning - 2nd bad time: 1 stroke penalty - 3rd bad time: 2 stroke penalty - 4th bad time: Disqualification

**\*\*When a player, in a round, continues to be in violation of Pace of Play guidelines, Rule 6-7 requires that the player be disqualified\*\***
